

## Five Types of Old Testament Sacrifices

<b>Name of the Offering</b>	<b>Reference</b>	<b>Object Offered</b>	<b>Manner of Sacrifice</b>	<b>Role of Blood in the Offering</b>	<b>Purpose of the Offering</b>
<b>The Burnt Offering</b>	Lev. 1; 6:8-13	Bull, ram, male goat, male dove, or young pigeon without blemish. (Always male animals, but species of animal varied according to individual's economic status.)	Animal is killed, cut in pieces, burned	Sprinkled against the altar	Voluntary. Payment for sins in general
<b>The Grain Offering (aka Cereal or Meal Offering)</b>	Lev. 2; 6:14-23	Flour, bread, or grain made with olive oil and salt (always unleavened); or incense	Portion burned on the altar as an "aroma pleasing to the Lord"	None	Voluntary. Worship God, show honor and respect to God
<b>The Fellowship Offering (aka Peace Offering)</b>	Lev. 3; 7:11-36; 22:17-30; 27	Any animal without blemish. (Species of animal varied according to individual's economic status) Can be grain offering	Fat covering internal organs is burned	Sprinkled against the altar	Voluntary. Thanksgiving to God
<b>The Sin Offering</b>	Lev. 4:1-5:13; 6:24-30; 12:6-8	Male or female animal without blemish – as follows: bull for high priest or congregation, male goat for king; female goat or lamb for common person; dove or pigeon for slightly poor, tenth of an ephah of flour for the very poor.	Fat covering internal organs is burned	Sprinkled before the curtain, put on the horns of the altar, poured out at the base of the altar	Mandatory. Payment for unintentional sins
<b>The Guilt or Trespass Offering</b>	Lev. 5:14-6:7; 7:1-6, 14:12-18	Ram or lamb without blemish	All fat is burned	Sprinkled against the altar	Mandatory. Payment for sin against God and against others

**Poster Assignment:** Create a poster that charts the five types of sacrifices found in Leviticus 1-7. Be sure to include the following: headings, name of the offering, object offered, manner of sacrifice, role of blood in the offering, and purpose of the offering. Bring your poster to class. You may drop off your poster in class when you arrive to the school (Make sure your name is on the back of your poster). Make sure you familiarize yourself with the content and be prepared to discuss in class.

**Purpose and Goal of Assignment:** The poster is in lieu of completing the chart of Five Types of Old Testament Sacrifices on the Pentateuch test. Completing the poster will allow students to engage the material, understand the complexity of the Old Testament sacrificial system, and gain a greater appreciation for the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.
